Dynamic Learning Environment

Incorporating UDL allows us to create a more inclusive and dynamic online environment that promotes student access and success while decreasing student barriers.

UDL Use is the online classroom

An online course needs to be dynamic with tools and supports built into every course

- **plan with the end in mind “know the why”**
- **Clear learning goals “co-create success criteria”**
- **Allow students to have a voice and choice**
- **For every lesson we need to think of student needs**
